The Foundation remains firmly committed to assisting in the education of isolated and disadvantaged young people from remote areas of NSW and the border areas of adjoining states. Our support this year has again been in providing bursaries to assist with school boarding fees, bursaries and equipment grants for students moving towards apprenticeships while still at school with the Through to TAFE program and scholarships for undergraduates at Charles Sturt University.

The need for our support varies greatly. The impact on and demand for our scholarships and bursaries when climatic conditions are unfavourable in the bush is extraordinary. As a consequence of the changing demands for our support we need to maintain and expand our fundraising efforts to ensure that we can always support our bursary and scholarship programs.

AGM and Board Meetings

The Foundation's AGM was held in October 2016 and the office bearers for 2017 were reappointed with Richard Dougan, Chairman, Rod Cowdroy, Deputy Chairman and John McRae, Treasurer. No changes to the Directors have been made at this time.

Bursaries

This year we have awarded 24 Secondary Boarding Bursaries and rejected a number of applications which did not meet our funding requirements. The bursaries are for students attending:

Scholarships at Charles Sturt University

Our support for Scholarships at Charles Sturt University has been maintained at five this year with three undergraduates funded by BCEF and two funded for the third and final year of their degree through family bequests from the Gaudry and Pockley families. All of our scholarship recipients have again achieved very high academic levels with a grade point average of 5.65 out of 7.0.

Once again we salute all our supporters and donors for your greatly valued assistance. The results achieved by those we have supported in the last year have been outstanding.



Weather and Climate Change in the Bush

We appreciate and continue to rely heavily on your support for young people in outback NSW. Many areas have had relieving rainfall however the chances of sustained negative values of the Southern Oscillation Index (SOI) shown below (-7) often indicates the potential for a return of El Niño episodes. These negative values are usually accompanied by sustained warming of the central and eastern tropical Pacific Ocean, a decrease in the strength of the Pacific Trade Winds, and a reduction in winter and spring rainfall over much of eastern Australia and the Top End.
